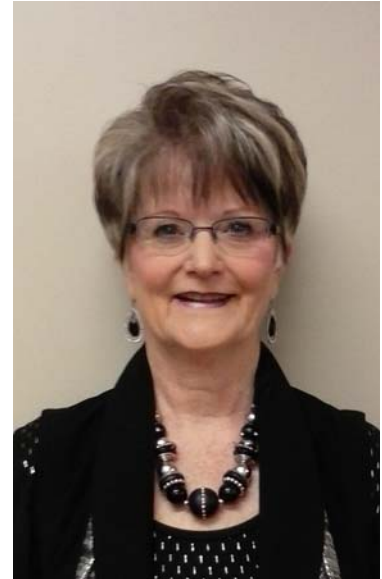
Note from the Director, Maribeth
